AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A skull with the lower jaw and all the bones of the neck, together with part of the cheekbone of another person mixed in. Apart from some dried brain tissue inside the skull, there were no soft tissues surviving.

As established from anthropology examination, the remains were from a male adult, although it was not possible to be any more precise as regards age or to determine anything further.

There was evidence of a probable gunshot injury to the head, with the skull being fragmented and a large defect present on the left side of the top, the most likely entry site. Tiny metal fragments were present with the tissues, presumably in the brain, to support this suggestion.

Although the rest of the body was missing, the injury to the head would certainly be the most likely cause of death.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 333BP was:

Gunshot injury to head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
