AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

A skull, with the lower jaw and the upper two bones in the neck. There were no soft tissues surviving.

As established from anthropology examination, the skull was from a male adult, but it was not possible to be any more precise as regards age or to determine anything further.

The skull was fractured on the right side above the ear, with a curious defect in the bone. The appearances suggested however, that this occurred after death, possibly caused by the tooth of a digger or other vehicle. The lower jaw was also fractured but again, most likely this occurred after death.

There were no other injuries or findings, and from this examination, it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 388BP was:

Unascertained
