## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## SUMMARY:

The body was partially skeletonized with deep saponified and mummified transformation of the soft tissues. The person was male.

As estimated from anthropological data, the man aged between 31 – 63 and measured 172.7 +/- 7.7 cm. There were no particular identifying features.

He had been shot in of the right cheek causing the fracture of the skull base, facial bones and vault. He had been shot also in the lower right chest.

He would appear to have died from a gunshot injury to the head and trunk, which caused the fracture of the base of the skull and of the right bones of the face.

He died from the injuries he received.

## CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 390B was:

Gunshot wound to the head and trunk

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
