AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A partly complete body, with the lower legs and feet missing. Some parts were skeletonized but there was soft tissue and skin elsewhere, particularly on the trunk and thighs.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 31 and 71, and measured from 164 to 180 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

He died from a gunshot wound to the head, the bullet probably entering the right side of the back and exiting through the upper part of the left side of the face, causing extensive fracturing of the skull around. There was a second shot to his right wrist, one of the bones being fractured and an intact bullet found alongside.

Elsewhere, there was a fracture of the lower end of the right femur which may or may not have occurred before death, and fractures of several ribs and of the pelvis, which almost certainly were post mortem, from crushing of the body.

When found there was clothing still on the upper half of his body, and his hands were tied in front of him by a cloth ligature around the wrists.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 391BP was:

Gunshot injury to head
