SUMMARY:

This was the badly decomposed and partially skeletonized remains of a male person. The skull, including the facial bones were badly fractured and some of the bone fragments were missing. When the skull was reconstructed there was a defect at the back consistent with an entrance bullet hole. This defect and the extent of damage to the remainder of the skull would be consistent with the passage of a bullet through the head, probably being directed from front to back.

The body was almost completely intact.

The anthropology report shows that at the time of his death this individual was aged between 12 and 16 years.

A significant finding at autopsy was the presence of a ligature around the wrists with the arms held behind the back.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 399B** was:

Bullet wound of the head
