## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

These were the almost complete remains of a deeply saponified body.

From the anthropological data the person was male, aged between 31 and 71.

The autopsy revealed he had been shot 5 times: A). a bullet would appear to have passed across the left side of the chest, fracturing several ribs, where the bullet's core fragments were recovered; B). the second bullet had struck the lower third of the left humerus, fracturing the bone, metal bullet's fragments were found in the "focus"; C). the third bullet had penetrated the lower third of the right humerus, fracturing the bones in comminuted fragments; D). the fourth bullet struck the left femoral neck, metal bullet fragments were found; E). the fifth bullet had struck the lower third of the left femur, fracturing the bones.

With such a gunshot injury it is highly likely that there would have been associated internal damage or complications.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 423B was:

Gunshot wounds to the trunk and limbs

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
