## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## SUMMARY:

These remains were partially mummified and skeletonized and were received with a knotted cloth loop likely representing a wrist ligature.

Anthropological data established that the person was a man, aged 31 to 71 years and had a stature of about 167 cm. no other distinctive identifying features were discovered.

Autopsy revealed evidence of three separate gunshot wounds to the right lower extremity, two causing sever bony and presumed soft tissue damage. The third was a superficial wound of the foot, all three came from right to left and were consistent with implication during life.

There was extensive fracture of the skull with many missing fragments. No definite gunshot pattern could be established, but the injuries were suspicious for gunshot wound.

There were also bilateral rib and left scapular fractures, most likely the result of crushing of the body after death.

## CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 432B was: Multiple gunshot wounds

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
