SUMMARY:

Almost entire body, partly skeletonized with head and some other parts separated due to liquefication of soft tissues.

Sex is that of a male, estimated age is 31-60 years and estimated height is 166.7 +/- 7.7 from anthropological data.

Compound fracture found in the skull appears to be that of a high velocity firearm injury to head however conclusion cannot be arrived at due to lack of typical feature of bullet hole injury and absence of a bullet or its fragments. The high velocity-type firearm injuries found in the left thigh and the buttock that are fatal injuries in the ordinary cause. All these injuries are ante mortem and have been inflicted from behind.

The fractures found in the feet and hand are post mortem fractures and even the fracture found in vertebrae and ribs are also of post mortem injuries.

Apart from the dentures, there were no other special features of identification

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 433B** was:

Multiple firearm injuries
