SUMMARY:

Partly skeletonized body, with fractured skull. Some soft tissue remains in the pelvis and the legs. Sex identified as male by the presence of mummified external genitalia. All bones of the body are intact. Estimated height is 178.3 +/- 7.7 and estimated age is 31-71 years by anthropological data. No specific identifying features.

Fatal high velocity type firearm injury in the chest, penetrated through the chest cavity but, had not emerged through the anterior chest wall. Another bullet injury is found in the right thigh with a burst-out type fracture of the shaft of the femur. The 3rd bullet injury is found in right knee joint, fracturing all the bone of the knee joint. Both leg injuries are fatal in the ordinary cause of and had been inflicted from the back.

The ligature with a loop found with the bones of the hands indicating that his upper arms had been ligated.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 437B** was:

Multiple firearm injuries
