AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

An almost complete body. There still was some adipocerous-mummified tissues adherent to the lower trunk.

The person was male, and from the anthropological data he was 35 - 75 years old, he measured 176.7 + 1 - 7.7 cm.

He had received a substantial injury to his face, causing fractures of his upper facial bones involving the nose, the temporal, the zygomatical and maxilla. This could have been the result of stamping, or a severe blow from some heavy object. There was also a fracture of the right radius at its upper third.

Despite the clear evidence of blunt force trauma, it was difficult to say whether this occurred before or after death.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 448B** was:

Unascertained
