AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete body minus only few phalanges of the left hand and the left foot. There was a substantial amount of soft tissue still present. The brain and the internal organs of the thorax were still inside the body.

The person was male as judged from soft tissue evidence and as estimated from anthropological data was aged between 25 and 65 years and measured from 164 to 180 cm (mean: 172 cm) in height. He had a full beard with short black hair.

There was a blindfold around the head, covering the eyes and a ligature around both wrists.

There were a number of metal fragments in the left upper arm. The left scapula as well as the head of the left humerus showed comminuted fractures. Although with such a gunshot injury which was consistent with a high velocity gunshot wound, it is highly likely that there would have been associated major blood vessel damage, this cannot be definitely proved and so the cause of death must remain unascertained.

The fractures of the right scapula, multiple ribs of both sides and both pubic arc probably were caused by post mortem influence.

There were no other injuries nor other findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 459B was:

Unascertained
