## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

Parts of a skull and lower jaw, still with some hair and firm brain tissue adherent.

From anthropology examination it was not possible to determine the age range of the person or to say whether they were male or female.

The skull was extensively fractured with a substantial part of the right side missing, including the right side of the lower jaw. Of the portions remaining, none of the fractures showed any specific features of gunshot damage and so it is difficult to confirm what caused the fracturing or whether indeed it occurred before or after death.

There were no other findings and from this examination it is not possible to determine the cause of death in this person.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 339BP** was:

Unascertained
