SUMMARY:

Partly skeletonized human remains with all the bones of the skeleton except left foot bones. However, there were an extra right scapula and a cranial fragment probably a contaminant from another skeleton. All the other bones were constituted to one individual, but all the remains together belong to more than one individual.

Anthropological data confirmed that the sex is that of a male, estimated stature is 173.9 +/- 7.7 cms and estimated age is 31-71 years of the individual. The other identification features may be the possible claw-hand deformity on left hand and the dentures in both upper and lower jaws.

The deceased had died due to blunt force-type injury to the head, likely to be a heavy blow from a blunt weapon such as a club, probably directed from behind. The cranial injury is fatal, but the deceased may have been alive for some time after receiving the blow. He also had sustained a firearm injury to the pelvic region from behind. There is evidence to show that the hands of the deceased had been ligated.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 353B** was:

Blunt force injury to the head associated with firearm injury to the pelvis
