SUMMARY:

The upper half of a body only with the pelvis and legs missing. The remains were largely skeletonized and disarticulated, with only a little soft material adherent in some areas.

The person was male as estimated from anthropology data, and adult, but it was not possible to be any more precise with regard to age or to give any estimate of his height. The only real identifying feature was an old injury to his left elbow which, by the extent of the residual roughening and distortion of the bone edges, must have left him with a very stiff joint with limited movement.

He died probably from a gunshot injury to the head which had fragmented much of the skull. The bullet appeared to have entered at the back on the right side and exited in the region of the right eye.

There was fragmentation of one of the thoracic vertebrae in the spine which could possibly have been another gunshot injury, but equally may have been post mortem in nature. There were almost certain post mortem crushing injuries to the ribs, and a fracture of one of the bones of the left forearm which could have occurred either before or after death.

When found, he was wearing a shirt, and there was a ligature around his wrists.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 193BP** was:

Gunshot injury to head
