AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

Almost fully skeletonized human remains with very little pultaceous soft tissue attached to it.

The determined sex is male, estimated height is 184.3 +/- 7.7 cm and age is 27 to 71 years, by the anthropologist. No special identification features found.

The deceased has died of firearm injuries to the head, there being at least two shots from different directions, from a distance, by a high velocity firearm. He also sustained a similar firearm injury to his right thigh, from a distance. All the injuries appear to have been sustained at the same time, and death was likely to have been instantaneous.

At the time of his death the deceased had been blindfolded. The body appeared to have been subjected to compression after death, as indicated by rib fractures.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 198B** was:

Multiple firearm injuries to head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
