AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

CASE NO: KK3 231B

AUTOPSY DATE: 27.07.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

An almost complete body minus only the right patella and a few bones from the right hand. There was a substantial amount of soft tissue still adherent.

As estimated from anthropological data the person was male, aged between 30 and 60 years and measured from 166 to 181 cm (mean: 173 cm) in height. There were no particular identifying features.

There was a bullet lodged within the soft tissue of the right thoracic half, which probably entered the body at the left scapula, travelled tangentially through the dorsal aspects of the 1st and 2nd thoracic vertebrae and reached the right pleural cavity. The pelvis showed shattered fractures of both sides. There were two bullets lodged within the soft tissue of the pelvis. Another bullet was lying within the soft tissue of the left femur near the destroyed left hip. There also was a bullet lodged in the spinal canal of the 10th thoracic vertebra. This bullet must have entered from the back. There also were fragments of a jacket of a bullet lodged in the soft tissue of the right forearm.

The skull was fragmented severely. Other fractures were located on the right clavicle, both scapulae, the left humerus and multiple ribs of both sides of the thorax. These fractures were probably caused by post-mortem influence. The man obviously died from multiple gunshot injuries to the trunk. Altogether 5 bullets and one jacket of a bullet were found in the body.

There were no other injuries nor other findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 231B was:

Multiple gunshot wounds to the trunk.

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
