AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

The lower part of a body only – the pelvis and both legs – partly skeletonized but with some soft tissues still attached.

From anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 17 and 57 and measured from 164 to 179 cms in height. There were no identifying features.

He had been shot through the left lower leg, the bullet passing through and shattering the middle part of the shin bone in a direction from (his) right to left. There was also an almost intact bullet in his right thigh, but as there was no underlying bony injury, it presumably had passed through an intermediate target first. There were no other findings.

While a gunshot wound to the leg could prove fatal if untreated, owing to the lack of the rest of the body, it is not possible to say whether or not it was the fatal injury here, and so the cause of death is best left as unascertained

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 233BP** was:

Unascertained
