## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## SUMMARY:

The lower part of a body only – the lumbar spine, pelvis and legs, but minus the feet. The remains were largely skeletonized, with only a little greasy material adherent.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 27 and 71, and measured from 162 to 178 cms. in height. There were no other identifying features.

Both sides of the pelvis were fractured, as were the lower ends of the right femur and the shin bones. These had the appearance of post mortem injuries caused by crushing or moving the body after death, all the more likely given that the upper half of the body was also missing.

There were no other injuries or findings, and so the cause of death in this person from this examination, must remain unascertained
