## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

An almost complete body minus the left lower leg and a few small bones from the hands. The remains were largely skeletonized apart from pultaceous material adherent to the trunk and firmer material in the right foot.

From anthropology data, the person was male and was young – aged between 12 and 16. It was not possible to estimate his height however, and there were no other particular features.

He died form a gunshot wound to his head, the shot entering the right side of the top and exiting probably through the left side of the face.

He had also been shot through the right arm while it was bent, the bullet passing initially through the upper arm and then the forearm. There was a third shot through the left hip, fracturing the head of the femur. An intact bullet was recovered from inside the chest, implying a fourth shot here, albeit it was difficult to find evidence of its track in the tissues present.

When found, he was still fully clothed, but his arms were tied behind his back with a ligature around the wrists.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 244B was:

Gunshot wound of head
