## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

The lower part of a body only – the pelvis and both legs – totally skeletonized and disarticulated.

From anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 27 and 71, and measured from 155 to 171 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

The only injuries were a fracture of the upper part of the right side of the pelvis, with a large piece of bone missing, and a fracture of the right fibula in the lower leg. The former at least is likely to have been a post mortem injury from crushing or moving the body after death: the latter was probably similar.

There were no other findings and the cause of death in this person, from this examination, is unascertained.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 259BP was:

Unascertained
