AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

AUTOPSY DATE: 30.07.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

This body, although largely intact, was badly decomposed and partially skeletonized. Only the right upper limb appeared to be missing.

The autopsy revealed that this individual had been shot at least three times. Two bullets were recovered from the chest whilst the third was found adjacent to the fractured pelvis and sacrum.

In addition to the bullet wounds there appeared to be evidence of blunt force trauma to the head. The skull was extensively fractured and reconstruction revealed two elongated defects, one on the right side and another at the front in the forehead region. The appearances were indicative of blows from a penetrating weapon, possibly an axe or pick.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 268B was:

Bullet wounds of trunk Blunt force injury to head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
