AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

A skull, with the lower jaw and the top three bones in the spine. There were no soft tissues surviving.

As established from anthropology examination the remains were from a male adult, though it was not possible to be any more precise as regards age or to determine anything further, other than the fact that he had an upper denture in his mouth.

Although fragmented, there was clear evidence of a gunshot injury to the head, the bullet probably striking the skull tangentially, with an entrance hole above the left eye and the exit further back in front of the upper part of the ear. No bullet fragments were found.

There were no other injuries or significant findings.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 269BP was:

Gunshot injury of head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
