AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

Almost completely skeletonized human remains. The head and many other bones are detached due to lack of soft tissue. No clothing found with remains. The skeleton is incomplete due to lack of all bones of both legs, right hand and right scapula.

The sex is determined as male, the estimated age as 31-71 years and the estimated stature as 171.9 +/- 9.0 cms. No any special identification feature found.

Even though the skull is in a fragmented state, upon reconstruction a bullet-hole injury is found in the left temporal bone showing features of an entry wound. The possible exit is in the face, the deficiency of bone indicating that the deceased had been shot once from behind and it is a necessarily fatal injury.

The fracture found in the ribs, right clavicle and right humerus appears to be blunt force injury, however whether they are ante mortem injuries cannot be determined with reasonable accuracy.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 278BP** was: Firearm injury to the head
