AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

These skeletonized remains consisted of only part of a body. The head, both forearms and the feet were all missing.

The autopsy failed to reveal any obvious ante mortem injury on the remains, however, a bullet fragment was identified and recovered from the area of the trunk. Taking this finding into account it could be reasonable to conclude that death would be consistent with having been as a result of the individual being shot.

The anthropology report shows that the remains were those of a male youth aged 13 to 17.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 293B was: Findings consistent with bullet wound of trunk
