AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

These were skeletonized remains of an almost complete body. The skull was shattered and the right upper limb had a ligature.

From the anthropological data, the person was male, aged 31-72 years old and measured 171.8 cm in height.

He would appear to have died from a gunshot injury to the head, which had caused complete fragmentation of the cranium, typical of the high velocity rifle injury.

The entry hole wound was placed on the left tempora, parietal bone, the direction of the shot was perpendicular to the bone surface. On the right parietal bone there was the exit hole. In the right frontal region were the bullets core fragments.

The pelvis and ribs fractures were post mortal.

He died from the injuries he received.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 313B** was:
Gunshot wound of head
