## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

A complete body, partly skeletonized but with a substantial amount of soft tissue still remaining, largely converted to adipocere.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 31 and 71, and measured from 169 to 184 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

He died from a gunshot wound to the head, the bullet entering immediately above the right ear, and exiting from the left side of the top of the head. There was extensive fracturing around both.

The only other injuries were fractured ribs on both sides of the chest, almost certainly the result of crushing or moving the body after death.

When found, there was clothing on the lower part of the body and a ligature around his wrists, made of nylon string.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 495B was:

Gunshot injury to head
