## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## SUMMARY:

A complete body, mostly skeletonized, but with greasy soft tissues.

The only injuries were fractured ribs, left clavicle, pelvis and right forearm bones likely to post mortem in nature from moving and/or crushing the body.

The body had a cloth ligature around left forearm.

The ligature, which has been found, suggests that this individual was tied up before his death. An additional metacarpal bone (from another individual) was found

As established from anthropology data, this person was male, aged between 31 and 65 measured 172.3 +/- 7.7 cms in height. The C2/C3 vertebra fusion has been found.

There were no other findings and so the cause of death of this person, from this examination, remains unascertained.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 498B** was:
