## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

A complete body apart from the left collarbone and some of the small bones of the hands which were missing. The remains were largely skeletonized and disarticulated apart from dried leathery skin still present in some places and greasy soft tissue elsewhere

The person was male as established from anthropology data, aged between 30 and 50, and measured from 167 to 183 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features

He died from a gunshot wound to the head, the bullet apparently passing through the top of the left side of the skull from left to right, with entrance and exit holes in the same general area and fracture lines radiating from them

There was a single rib fracture at the back of the left side of the chest which may or may not have been caused during life from a blow or a fall, and fractures of the front of the pelvis which were almost certainly post mortem in nature, from crushing or moving the body after death

There were no other significant findings

## CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 500B was:

Gunshot injury to head
