## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

The lower legs and feet of a person, still with some soft tissue attached to the latter but skeletonized elsewhere.

From anthropology examination the remains were from an adult but it was not possible to say whether male or female to determine anything further.

There was evidence of a probable gunshot injury to the right knee, fragmenting the upper end of the shin bone and with a tiny bullet fragment found alongside. There was also a fracture of the middle part of the left shin bone, but much of the bone was missing and it was difficult therefore to confirm what caused this injury or whether it occurred before or after death.

Although a gunshot injury to the leg could prove fatal if untreated, with the absence of the rest of the body it is not possible to establish whether this <u>was</u> the cause or whether there were injuries elsewhere which were.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 503BP** was:

Unascertained
