SUMMARY:

These saponified and partially mummified remains were received with the hands and wrists tied behind the back by a cloth ligature, consistent with ante mortem ligature.

Anthropological data established that this was an adolescent body, aged 11-15 years. His stature could not be calculated. His head hair was brown and straight. He wore a distinctive T-shirt. His remains indicated a, thin, small chest. No other identifying features could be established.

Autopsy revealed the presence of a gunshot wound to the head which passed through the region of the brain. The wound passed from back to front and left to right.

Also present were gunshot wounds of the right thigh and pelvis and of the left leg, just above the ankle.

All gunshot wounds were consistent with ante mortem injury.

Also present were rib, scapular and pelvic fractures consistent with crushing of the body after death.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 507B was:

Gunshot wound to the head
