AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

An almost complete body, but minus the head. The remains were completely skeletonized, with no soft tissue remaining whatever.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 31 and 60, and measured from 167 to 182 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

There were fractures of most of the ribs on both sides of the chest, and of the right upper arm. The former may well have occurred post mortem, from crushing or moving the body. It was not possible however; to say what caused the arm fracture or to decide whether it occurred before or after death.

There were no other findings and so the cause of death in this person, from this examination, remains unascertained.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 513B** was: **Unascertained**

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
