AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

The upper part of a body with pelvis and both lower limbs are all missing. The body was almost completely skeletonized. There was only one piece of clothing present (a vest), and a blindfold was present among the fragmented skull remains, in addition to a loose ligature among the other remains.

From anthropology data the body parts were of a male whose age was estimated as above 31 years but the stature could not be estimated. There was a loose denture with gold crowns among the skull remains.

Examination of the reconstructed skull bones showed an entrance bullet wound in the back of the skull and a larger defect (possibly an exit wound) in the skull base. There were two bullets recovered from the chest and it is most likely that one bullet injured the skull and then entered the chest cavity. There were other fractured bones of the thorax and left arm which were all consistent with gunshot injuries.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 524BP was:

Gunshot injuries to the head, chest and left arm
