AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

There were partially skeletonized remains consisting essentially of the upper half of the body minus the distal right upper extremity.

Anthropological data established the person to be a male, 31 to 65 years of age. Stature was not estimated. No other identifying features were noted.

Autopsy disclosed evidence of three gunshot wounds to the chest region. One appeared to enter in the left shoulder region, passing through the back of the superior portion of the scapula from the left toward the right and front. The other two entered through the right scapula and passed from back to front. There were gunshot rib fractures on the left. Bullets were recovered, and metallic fragments were observed.

In addition, there were multiple bilateral rib fractures and a cranial fracture due to crushing of the body after death.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 528BP was:

Gunshot wounds to the chest

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
