AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

Incomplete human remains, partially skeletonized, partially saponified.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged over 31, but his stature cannot be found. There were no particular identifying features.

Although no any clear bevelling was found, and no metal fragments were seen within the head during fluoroscopy, the nature and extent of skull damages is certainly suggestive of high velocity rifle injury to the head.

Lacking parts of the skeleton may well occurred from post mortem crushing, or moving the body

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 529B** was: **Gunshot injury of the head**

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
