AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete body with only a few small bones of both hands missing. The body was almost completely skeletonized with only small amount of mummified tissue still attached to various body parts.

From anthropology data, the body was of a male whose age ranged between 15 and 71 years, and stature estimated as 165.8 +/- 7.7 cm. There were no other specific identifying features.

There was a gunshot injury through the right side of the pelvis and upper right thigh. There was also another gunshot injury to the left upper chest. The skull showed multiple extensive fractures involving the base and frontal aspects, but it was not possible to confirm if they were ante or post mortem; no bullets or fragments were recovered or detected radiologically.

Although the skull injuries may well have been the primary cause of death, the gunshot injuries to the pelvis and chest are potentially lethal and capable of severing large vessels causing considerable bleeding.

When found, the body had most of the clothes on and no ligatures were noticed.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 542B** was: **Gunshot injuries to the chest and pelvis**

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
