## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

An incomplete body with the head, neck and the left upper limb were missing, in addition to the left clavicle, left scapula and a few ribs and vertebral bones. The body parts were almost skeletonized with only small parts mummified. The body was partly clothed and a ligature was found near the bones of the right hand.

From anthropology data, the body was of a male whose age ranged between 17 - 25 and stature estimated as 178.3 +/- 7.7 cm. There were no other specific identifying features.

There were multiple gunshot injuries to the upper right chest, the pelvic area and the left lower limb as was shown by the multiple fractured bones, the recovered bullets and diagnosed radiologically. Any of the previously mentioned injuries can by itself be potentially fatal.

## **CAUSE OF DEATH:**

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 618B was: Gunshot injuries to the chest, pelvis and left lower limb

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
