AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

AUTOPSY DATE: 25.08.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

A complete body except for a few small bones of both hands. The body was almost completely skeletonized with only a few mummified tissue still attached. The body was partly clothed.

From anthropology data the body was of a male whose age ranged between 31 – 71 and stature estimated as 174.4 +/- 7.7 cm. there were no other specific identifying features.

There was a gunshot injury involving the right arm and the right side of the chest as was shown by the fractured humerus, isolated fracture of the right 7th rib, the recovered 3 bullet fragments from the chest area and the radiological findings. There was also a gunshot injury to the pelvis which has caused fragmentation of the left hip bone and head of the left femur, and 2 fragments were recovered from the pelvis and shown also radiologically.

The multiple fractures of the skull were most probably post mortem in nature

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 623B was:

Gunshot injuries to the chest and pelvis
