AUTOPSY REPORT

SUMMARY:

These were saponified remains received with a blindfold about the face, consistent with antemortem application of the blindfold.

Anthropology data established that the person was a man, 31 to 60 years of age, and about 173 cm in stature. The teeth were in relatively good condition suggesting that he was at the lower end of the age range. Either the left second or fourth finger was fixed at the distal interphalangenal joint. That finger could have appeared bent at all times. There were no other identifying features.

Autopsy revealed three gunshot wounds. Two were from front to back, passing through the lower thoracic and lumbar spine. The third was from back to front and left to right. All would have passed through vital vessels or organs.

Also present were bilateral rib fractures in a linear distribution, indicative of post mortem crushing of the remains.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 634B was:

Gunshot wounds of the abdomen and pelvis
