AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

Complete human remains, partially skeletonized. Neither ligature nor blindfold have been found. Under x- ray no metal parts were found.

The fractures, except the skull (ribs, limbs) may well have occurred post mortem from crushing or moving the body. He died probably from a gunshot wound to the left frontal part of the skull. None of the fragments showed any clear bevelling and no metal fragments were seen, but the nature and extent of the damage was certainly suggestive of a high velocity rifle injury.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 31 and 60, and measured 171.3 +/- 7.7 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 636B was:

Gunshot injury to the head
