AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

AUTOPSY DATE: 17.08.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

A complete and intact body with nearly all of the skin and soft tissues remaining and several of the internal organs surviving. The skin was dry and leathery.

The person was male and measured approximately 167 cms in height. From anthropological data he was aged between 31 and 63. He appeared to have fair hair but that apart, there were no obvious identifying features.

No injuries were found apart from fractured ribs on both sides of the chest. Given the degree of flattening of the trunk which was apparent, most likely these fractures were post mortem in nature, from crushing or moving the body after death. Certainly this could not be excluded.

There were no other obvious findings, external or internal, and so from this examination, the cause of death in this person, remains unascertained.

The only other observation was that he was carrying over 4000 DM in notes inside one of his shoes, folded up in a plastic bag.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 677B** was: **Unascertained**

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
