AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete body, missing only a few ribs and some small bones from the hands and feet. The remains were partly skeletonized, but with soft tissue still present in some areas.

As established from anthropology data, the person was male, aged between 31 and 71, and measured from 158 to 174 cms in height. There were no particular identifying features.

He would appear to have died from a gunshot injury to the back of the neck, which had fragmented two vertebrae and fractured the mandible. There were also fractures of the upper part of the left shoulder blade and of three adjacent ribs which may well have been part of the same injury. A number of bullet fragments were found in the region.

Elsewhere, there were comminuted fractures of the right upper arm bone, one of the bones of the left forearm, and of the left leg above the knee. These all appeared to be ante-mortem injuries and could have been further shots, but there were no obvious metal fragments associated with them and so it would be difficult to prove.

There were no other significant findings

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 679B** was:
Gunshot injuries to neck and chest
