AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete body, with much soft tissue still remaining, and only partial skeletonization.

From anthropology data, the person was male, adult (aged between 15 and 71) and measured from 156 to 172 cms in height. He had dark hair and at the time of his death, a stubbly beard, but this apart, there were no particular identifying features.

He had been shot several times in the trunk and legs, with three largely intact bullets recovered from the former and several bullet fragments from the left hip and thigh. The various shots had fragmented the spine in three places, extensively fractured the ribs and shoulder blades, and shattered the upper half of the left femur.

There were also fractures of both upper arm bones and the bones of both forearms, at least some of which could have been separate gunshot injuries or part of the tracks of the bullets entering the trunk. The left side of the face was fractured, as was the lower jaw, but those were probably post mortem in nature, from crushing or moving the body after death.

There were no other significant findings

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 686B** was: **Gunshot injuries to trunk and left leg**
