AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

CASE NO: KK3 688B

AUTOPSY DATE: 18.08.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

A complete body except for some small bones of the hands and feet which were missing. The body was partly skeletonized, but most of the soft tissue was preserved in a mummified state. The body was of a male from soft tissue examination.

From anthropology data the age was estimated to range between 31 - 71 years and the stature as 176.9 +/- 7.7. There were two artificial dental plates and one metal crown.

There was an extensive gunshot injury of the left leg causing fragmentation of the lower parts of both the tibia and fibula which were missing from the body. There was another gunshot injury to the same limb (left) as shown by the recovered fragmented bullet from the left thigh, but there was no skeletal fracture.

Other injuries of the right ribs and scapula were probably post mortem in nature

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 688B was:

Gunshot injury of the left lower limb

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
