AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

AUTOPSY DATE: 17.08.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

A complete body with only a few small bones of both hands and feet missing. The body was almost completely skeletonized and retained some mummified soft tissue remains.

From anthropology data the body was of a male whose age ranged between 15–71 and stature estimated as 167.1 +/- 7.7 cm. There was an artificial eye present within the left orbital cavity.

There was a gunshot injury to the head with an entrance bullet wound situated at the posterior part of the right temporal bone. Fragments of the bullet were recovered from the skull. In addition, there was another gunshot injury to the right shoulder and upper right chest as evidenced by multiple fragmented fractures of bones of that area and fragments of bullets shown radiologically.

There was a localised depressed fracture of the posterior part of the left parietal bone, but it was not possible to confirm whether it was ante or post mortem in nature.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 700B** was: **Gunshot injuries to the head and chest**
