## **AUTOPSY REPORT**

## **SUMMARY:**

A complete body except for small bones of both right and left hands, the coccyx in addition to the whole right foot; all were missing. The body was almost completely skeletonized with remains of mummified tissue attached.

From anthropology data the body was of a male whose age ranged between 16 - 21 and stature estimated as 175.5 + 1 - 7.7 cm. There were no other specific identifying features.

There were gunshot injuries involving the bones of the right hand and lower thoracic vertebrae. Since the body was found with a ligature attached to the hands, it is most likely that it was shot from the back injuring the bound right hand and going through the lower thoracic vertebrae and then the bullet was deflected upward where it was recovered lying within the left side of the chest.

There was a relatively large skull defect which in my opinion was most probably post mortem in nature.

## CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 720B was:

Gunshot injuries of the chest
