AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

These were partially skeletonized remains received with the head and eye regions covered by a cloth blindfold.

Anthropological data established the person to have been an adolescent male, 12 to 16 years of age, standing about 172 cm tall. He had dark brown, straight hair, but there were no other identifying features.

Autopsy revealed four gunshot wounds; at least one of which passed from back to front. There was one to the chest, one to the pelvic region and one each to the lower extremities. The first two passed through regions likely to be associated with severe internal bleeding.

Also present were anterior, non-displaced fractures of right ribs indicative of post mortem crushing of the body.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 729B was:

Gunshot wounds to the trunk

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
