AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

These were partially skeletonized remains, received complete, but somewhat jumbled.

Anthropological data established that the person was a male, aged between 31 and 60 years and about 172 cm in height. Other than light brown head hair, no other identifying features were discovered.

There was a gunshot wound of the pelvis region which entered in the right posterior (buttock) and passed through the pelvis in a back to front and right to left direction. The bullet was recovered from the left hip region. The wound would have passed through the iliac anteriorly, leading to extensive internal bleeding.

Also present were bilateral rib fractures in a distribution consistent with post mortem crushing of the remains.

The head was also involved by multiple fractures, the distribution of these was consistent with crushing, but other features suggested a gunshot origin. No definite entrance or exact defect could be found.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number **KK3 732B** was: **Gunshot wound to the pelvis**

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
