AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

SUMMARY:

A complete and largely intact body, with much of the skin and soft tissue still remaining, apart from on the front of the trunk where it was beginning to break down.

The person was male, and as established from anthropology data, was aged between 31 and 60, and measured from 171 to 186 cms in height. At the time of his death he had a short dark beard, but there were no other identifying features.

He had been shot in the right hip, the bullet fracturing the head of the femur and the adjacent part of the pelvis, and lodging beneath the skin of the lower part of the back without exiting.

No other gunshot wounds were seen, the only other injuries being fractured ribs on both sides of the chest, likely to have been post mortem in nature from crushing or moving the body after death.

A gunshot injury to the hip, if untreated, could prove fatal. It would not necessarily be so however, and in this person, some other factor may have intervened beforehand. For this reason, it is probably best to leave the cause of death as unascertained

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 759B was:

Unascertained
