SUMMARY:

These were the complete, mummified remains of a man clad only in bikini style shorts and a sock.

Anthropological data established that he was 31 to 71 years of age and had a stature of about 162 cm. He had suffered a fracture of his left femur years prior to death, and it had healed improperly, giving a large remnant callus. No degenerative changes of the femoral head were found and it is unlikely he walked with a limp. His head hair was dark brown. No other identifying features were discovered.

Autopsy disclosed evidence of two gunshot wounds. One passed through the distal left forearm, fracturing the humerus. The other passed through the head from left to right, entering the left posterior parietal region.

In addition, there were multiple rib fractures indicative of crushing of the body after death.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 760B was:

Gunshot wound to the head

This formal report is based upon the autopsy report that I prepared at the time of my examination. Both reports truly and accurately reflect my findings.
