AUTOPSY REPORT

KOZLUK GRAVE SITE

CASE NO: KK3 774B

AUTOPSY DATE: 24.08.99

MORTUARY: Visoko

SUMMARY:

A complete body except for a few small bones of the right hand. The body was partly skeletonized and the soft tissues showed mummification. The body was partly clothed. External soft tissue examination showed that it was of a male. Examination of the intact body showed the stature to be 172 cm.

From anthropology data, the age was estimated to range between 31 - 65 and stature as 178.7 + 7.7 cm. There were no other specific identifying features.

Examination of the body did not show obvious injuries or bone fractures which can be considered fatal in nature. The multiple fractured ribs on both sides of the body and fracture fibula of both legs are most probably post mortem in nature. The cause of death therefore, could not be ascertained.

CAUSE OF DEATH:

It is my determination that the cause of death in case number KK3 774B was:

Unascertained
